

COST OF STUDY 2017-2018

Cranbrook Academy of Art's official Cost of Study is divided into two parts: *Fixed Costs* (tuition, fees, health insurance) and *Estimated Costs* (housing, food, supplies, transportation, personal expenses). The official Cost of Study encompasses both Fixed and Estimated Costs. **Note: The Financial Aid Cost of Attendance differs slightly (it includes loan fees); this document can be found in the Financial Aid section of the Academy's website.*

Fixed Costs: Fixed Costs will not vary.

Tuition (<i>½ of total due on or before 1st day of each semester</i>)	\$35,406
Lab/Facility Fee (<i>½ of total due on or before 1st day of each semester</i>)	\$1,200
Student Activities Fee (<i>½ of total due on or before 1st day of each semester</i>)	\$100
Matriculation Fee (1st year students only) (<i>full amount due on or before 1st day of fall semester</i>)	\$200
Graduation Fee (2nd year students only) (<i>full amount due on or before 1st day of spring semester</i>)	\$200
Accident & Sickness Insurance (mandatory) <i>(full amount due on or before 1st day of fall semester)</i> <i>*May be waived if student has comparable insurance; a two-step waiver process must be completed by a date that will be communicated to all students in summer 2017. All students are charged for health insurance, and only those students completing the two-step waiver process in the required timeframe are eligible for removal of the charge.</i> <i>NOTE: If you waived last year and want to waive again this year, you must complete the waiver process again (before the deadline) – if you do not do so, you will be charged for the insurance. Estimated Costs: Estimated Costs will vary based on choices made by the individual student; students may spend more or less depending on personal lifestyle choices.

Housing and Food	\$8,790
Supplies <i>Cost of Supplies varies based on student choices regarding their work; this is an estimate of average costs. Use of most media lab and woodshop equipment is covered in the lab fee. Printing is available on campus for a fee at a competitive rate. Use of on-campus digital fabrication machines (including CNC router, CNC plasma router, laser cutter) is currently \$20/hour or \$500/academic year, which includes use of all digital fabrication machines.</i>	\$3,050

***Single rooms are generally not available for 1st year students. 1st year students requesting single rooms will be placed on a waiting list based on the date the dorm request is received.

Notes: Off-campus housing is available in the Detroit metropolitan area at a reasonable cost. Students living off-campus will need their own transportation, as the area surrounding the campus is not served by public transportation. Personal transportation is highly recommended for all students due to the absence of public transportation in the area; those without personal transportation will need to budget for cab fare or similar expenses.
