

# COST OF ATTENDANCE 2024-2025

## Class of 2025 (Returning 2nd Year Students)

Cranbrook Academy of Art's official Cost of Attendance is divided into two parts: **Fixed Costs** (tuition, fees, health insurance if international student) and **Estimated Costs** (Housing, food, supplies, transportation, personal expenses, and federal student loan origination fees). The official Cost of Attendance encompasses both Fixed and Estimated Costs.

**Fixed Costs:** Fixed Costs will not vary. *Tuition will remain fixed at \$44,450 in the 2024-2025 academic year; fees may increase.*

<b>Tuition</b> ( <i>½ of the total due on or before 1<sup>st</sup> day of each semester</i> )	\$44,450
<b>Lab/Facility Fee</b> ( <i>½ of the total due on or before 1<sup>st</sup> day of each semester</i> )	\$1,473
<b>Student Activities Fee</b> ( <i>½ of the total due on or before 1<sup>st</sup> day of each semester</i> )	\$100
<b>Graduation Fee</b> ( <i>1<sup>st</sup>-year students only</i> ) ( <i>full amount due on or before 1<sup>st</sup> day of fall semester</i> )	\$250
<b>Accident &amp; Sickness Insurance</b> (full amount due on or before 1 <sup>st</sup> day of the fall semester). All international students studying on F-1/J-1 visas are automatically enrolled and charged for health insurance. It is mandatory for international students.*  NOTE: <b>Domestic students</b> are not required to purchase Cranbrook's insurance, but all domestic students will be emailed information on how to enroll in Cranbrook's insurance plan. If you choose to enroll in Cranbrook's insurance, be aware that your fixed costs will increase by the <b>estimated cost of insurance</b> , \$2,158.	\$2,144

**Estimated Costs:** Estimated Costs will vary based on choices made by the individual student; students may spend depending on personal lifestyle choices.

<b>Housing</b> <i>Off-campus living</i>	\$5,810
<b>Food</b> <i>Meals both at home/not at home</i>	\$7,007
<b>Supplies</b> <i>Cost of Supplies varies based on student choices regarding their work; this estimates average costs. The lab fee covers the use of most media lab and woodshop equipment. Printing is available on campus for a fee at a competitive rate. Use of on-campus digital fabrication machines (including CNC router, CNC plasma router, laser cutter) is currently \$20/hour or unlimited use: \$250 per semester/\$500 per academic year.</i>  <i>Your department may have nominal fees related to the equipment or department lab costs. **Notes:** Off-campus Housing is available in the Detroit metropolitan area at a reasonable cost. Students living off-campus will need their transportation, as the area surrounding the campus is not served by public transport. Personal transportation is highly recommended for all students due to the absence of public transportation in the area. Those without personal transportation must budget for rideshare expenses like Uber /Lyft. Non-driving students deciding to live off campus are responsible for researching the cost to and from campus taking into consideration the schedule of department requirements with possible peak fare times.
